

'Fragments In The Sky' is about Raymond Moult-Spiers a prominent Australian Artist and WWII veteran. Although he spent most of his later life as a recluse on Stradbroke Island, Julie's research reveals that he had significant involvement with the City of Parramatta Art Society in his early years as one of CPAS' first members, and as an emerging contemporary artist.

At age 16, Dr Ambrose Reisch attended a talk at the Fairfield Art Society by an exciting artist of the day and one of CPAS' first members, Ray Moult-Spiers. The experience changed Reisch's life. Reisch acknowledges Moult-Spiers' input during these early years when he decided to study classical drawing in Florence, Italy, in the early 70s, followed by a full commitment to the Visual Arts.

Dr Ambrose Reisch, a former lecturer at the National Art School, Sydney, holds a Masters degree from the College of Fine Arts, Sydney, a PhD from Newcastle University in painting and exhibits regularly.

His works are represented in collections that include regional galleries, University and private collections.
